

The College's Student Disciplinary Procedure: in summary

- Students should behave appropriately at all times and maintain a standard of conduct that is not harmful to others or the College or University community, and the work, good order and good name of the College and University.
- The College's Student Disciplinary Procedure (the "Procedure") provides some examples of types of non-academic conduct which will normally be regarded by the College as breaches of acceptable standards of student conduct ("misconduct").
- **It is important that students familiarise themselves with the Procedure and those examples of misconduct**, which also appear in the Student Handbook. Misconduct under the Procedure can arise from a potentially wide range of behaviours. Lack of awareness of what amounts to misconduct is not an excuse and does not prevent the College from taking action.
- Some matters fall outside of what the College can consider, either because they comprise serious allegations that the College is not equipped to consider (for example, allegations of criminal offences), or because they fall properly for consideration under an alternative procedure of the College or University ("excluded offences").
- The procedure which the College will follow for considering allegations of misconduct which are not excluded offences is summarised in the flowchart below. It is important to note that:
 - in the event that a finding of misconduct is made, the Dean can impose various penalties, including a fine and/or withdrawal of privileges, up to and including expulsion from the College;
 - it is possible to appeal to the Governing Body against the decision of the Dean on certain grounds;
 - while a matter is under consideration by College, whether or not it ultimately comprises misconduct or a breach of College regulations, the Dean may impose temporary "precautionary measures" on students involved. The purpose of such measures is not punitive, but will comprise necessary and proportionate steps to safeguard the welfare of the College, or its members (including staff) or its ability to function as a community.
