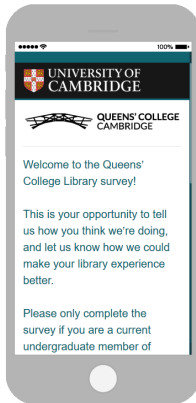
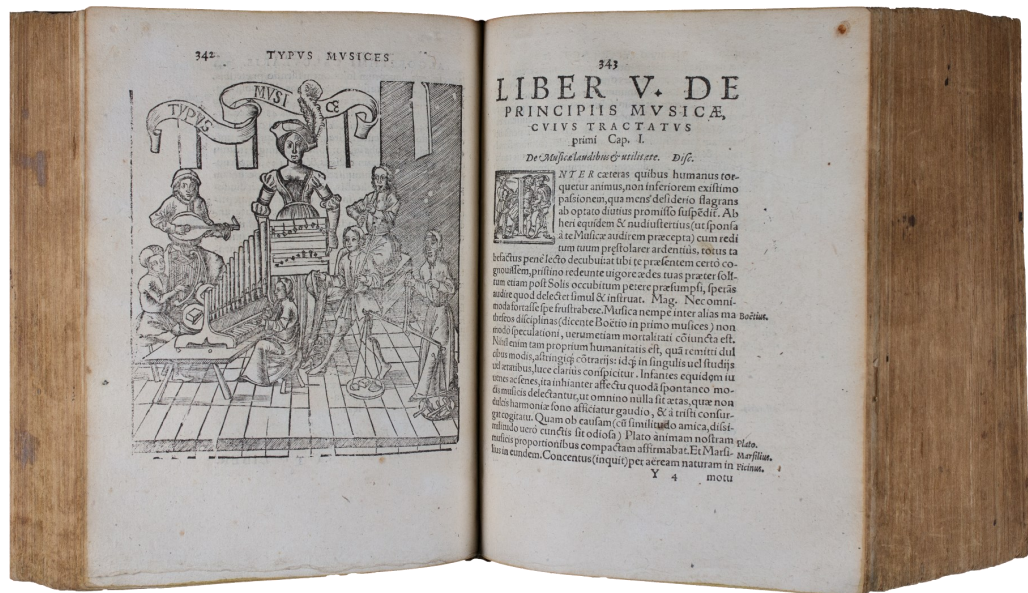


Queens' Library 5-minute student survey

The physical exhibition re-opens on 2-13 March, Monday-Friday, 1.30-4.30pm (closed on Tuesday 10).



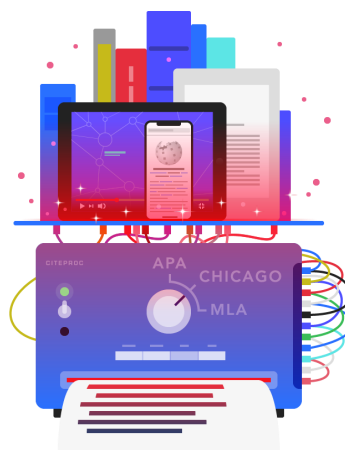
New self-issue machine - now with self-return!

If you missed our extended programme of Queens' Library research skills workshops in November, you can catch them again in the first week of February.

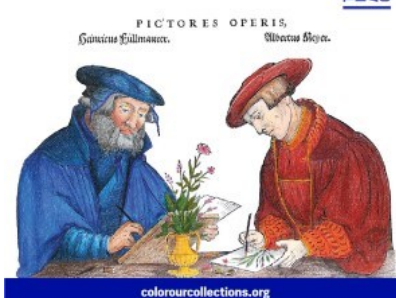
